CLEAN MONDAY

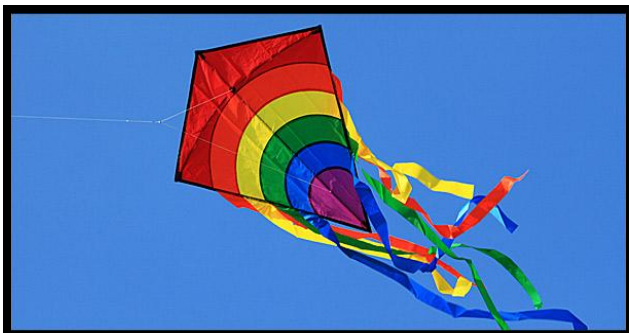
Clean Monday is a public holiday in Greece and Cyprus, and is celebrated with outdoor excursions, the consumption of shellfish and other fasting food, a special kind of flatbread, baked only on that day named "lagana" and the widespread custom of flying kites.



Eating meat, eggs and dairy products is traditionally forbidden to orthodox Christians throughout lent period (*which starts after clean Monday and lasts 40 days till Easter*), with fish being eaten only on major feast days, but shellfish is permitted in European denominations.



Clean Monday is considered to mark the beginning of the spring season!

As a religious nation, the Greek Orthodox Ester is a week-long celebration that includes a series of festivities. The Holly Week, is brimming with symbolic events, festivities and traditions followed by the whole nation.

One of the traditions is the red eggs. The tradition of boiling and dyeing eggs in the red color symbolizes the rebirth of life and the blood of Christ. They also make the Ester brioche, also known as tsoureki. This sweet bread is usually braided with three pieces of dough, which represent the Holy Trinity, and spiced with mahleb. It is served with a red hardboiled egg in the middle.



Another tradition is the Epitaphios. This special day seals the conclusion of the Passion of Christ with Christ's burial. On this day, bells ring multiple times throughout the day, and people head to church early to decorate the Epitaphios. The Good Friday mass takes place in the evening and is followed by a solemn procession around the block of the church.

On Easter Saturday churches are usually packed, and you will often see people spilling onto the church's pavvis with white candles, which will later be lit with the Holly light. The Resurrection of Christ is celebrated at midnight sharp; the priest proclaims "Christos Anesti" with bells ringing and fireworks lighting up the sky outside. People greet each other with a "Christos Anesti", lighting their candles along the way.

Finally, Easter Sunday is the end of the 40 days fasting period, and is celebrated with whole lambs roasting on a spit. Also the tradition of tsougrisma, can take place on Saturday evening. It's a fun game of children and adults alike and symbolizes the resurrection of the Lord. Throughout the nation, families spend the day together eating, drinking and celebrating this special occasion with a lot of singing and dancing.

- 732 kilos of gases generated by plastic production won't be released in the atmosphere.



The pupils and the teachers were happy to take part in this action. At the end of the procedure, we earned 20€ for the needs of our school.



Every consumer can recycle in one of the Integrated Rewarding Recycling Centers. In Egaleo city there is one in the Square of Estavromenos.

The Reward Recycling motto is: "Let's protect the earth....so that it will reward us ". I totally agree with it!

The ten fine arts are:

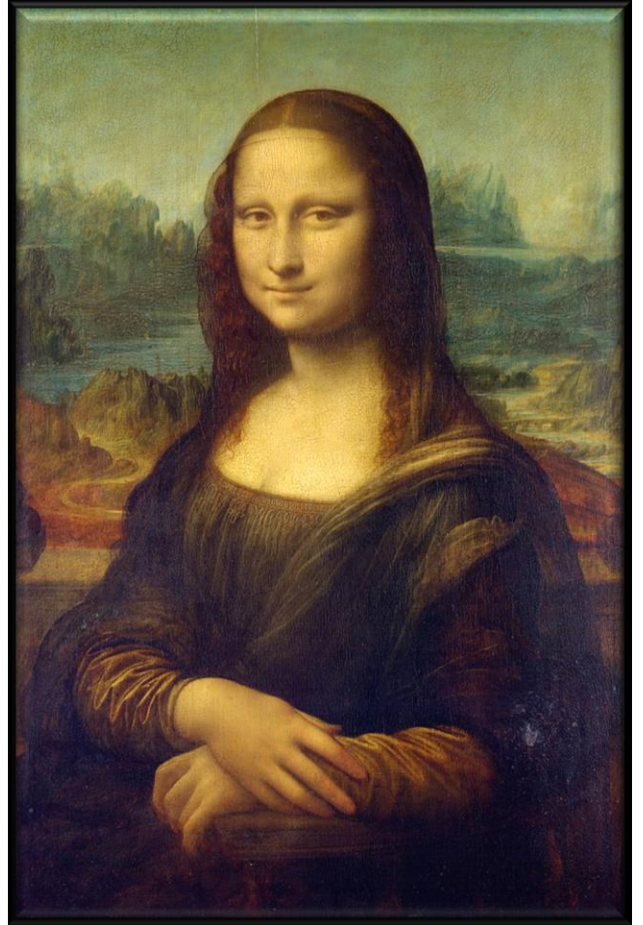
- Architecture

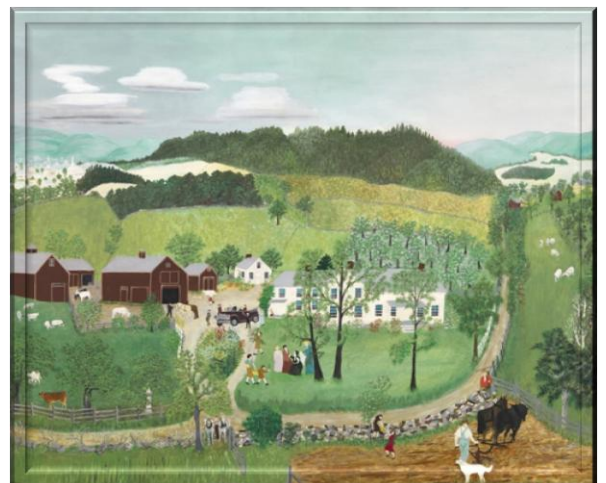
A biography of an important figure

Grandma Moses

Grandma Moses was born in September 7th, 1860 and she died in December 13th 1961 (aged 101). She was an American folk artist. She began painting in earnest at the age of 78 and is often thought of as an example of an individual who successfully began a career in the arts at an advanced age. Her works have been shown and sold in the United States and abroad and have been used on greeting cards. You can find many of her painting and collections at many museums. "Sugaring off" for instance, was sold for 1,2 US MILLION \$ IN 2006.

Grandma Moses wrote an autobiography (My life's history), won many awards and was awarded two honorary doctoral degrees.

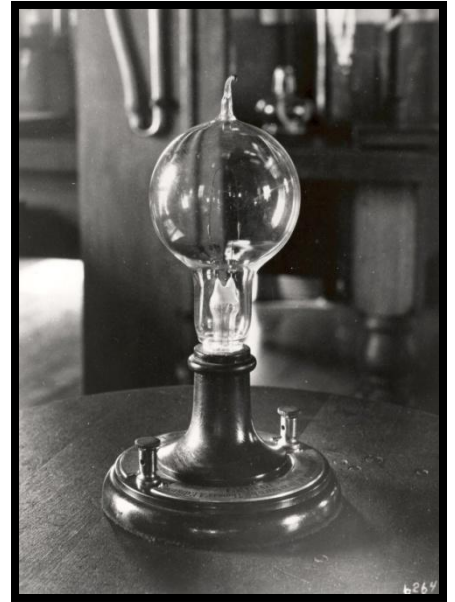

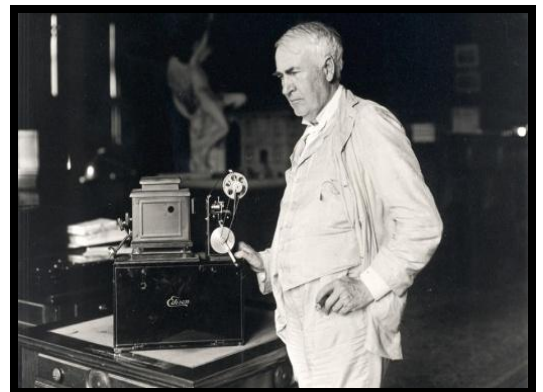
THOMAS EDISON

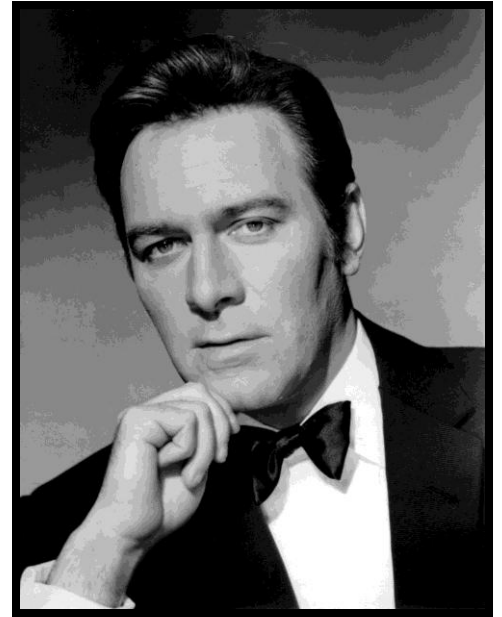
My favourite actor

ARTHUR CHRISTOPHER ORME PLUMMER

Arthur Christopher Orme Plummer was born in December 13, of 1929 in Toronto Ontario, Canada. He is a Canadian actor whose career has spanned six decades, beginning with his film debut in "Stage Struck" in 1958.

He is known for portraying Captain "George von Trapp" in "The sound of music". Plummer has received various award of privilege granted as a special honor for his work, including an Academy Award, a Genie Award, two Emmy Awards, two Tony Awards, a Golden Globe Award, a Screen Actors Guild Award and British Academy Film Award.



He's one of the few performers to receive the Triple Crown of Acting, and the only Canadian who won the Academy Award for the best Supporting Actor at the age of 82 for "Beginners". He received a nomination at the age of 88 for "All the money in the world", making him the oldest person to be nominated in an acting category.

I admire Plummer because he's a very old man but one of the best actors of the world. In my opinion, he proves that elderly people can do a lot.

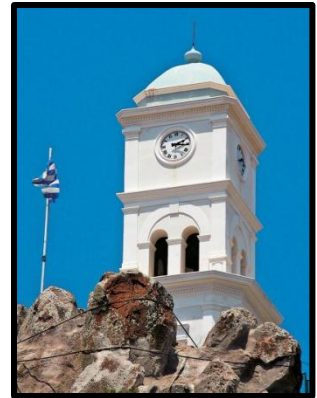
Traveling around Greece

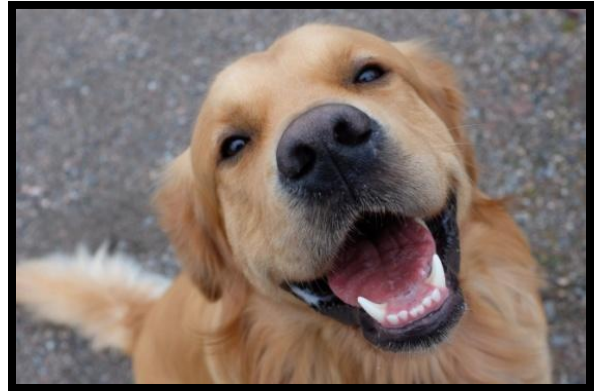

Sniffer dogs (usually beagles) are sometimes trained for this job. Dogs have even been sent by Russians into outer space a few years before any human being was. The first dog ever sent up was named Laika, but she died within a few hours.

RECIPES

CHEESECAKE

Ingredients

- 1 packet of whipped cream
- 2 table spoons of sugar
- 1 packet of cream cheese
- 12 grams gelatin
- Vanilla extract
- 2 packets of plain biscuits or digestive biscuits
- 70 grams butter

Steps

- Crush the plain biscuits until fine crumbs
- Melt your butter and add to the biscuits
- Arrange your biscuits in the bottom of the pan, evenly and press them. Put in the freeze until you make layers
- Whipped cream cheese, sugar, vanilla extract alone
- Whipped cream alone
- Add the mixture and mix
- Dissolve your gelatin in warm water and add it slowly to the mixture
- Pour it over the biscuits layer and put it in the fridge for at least 5 hours
- Use chocolate and caramel in any way you like to garnish it
- Ready to enjoy!

TENNIS

Tennis is an Olympic sport and is played at all levels of society and at all ages. The sport can be played by anyone who can hold a racket, including wheelchair users.



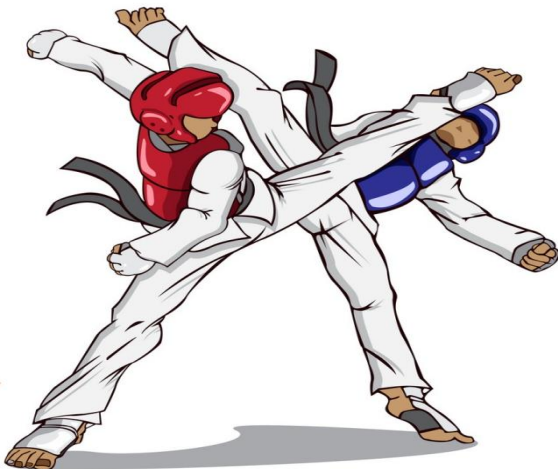
